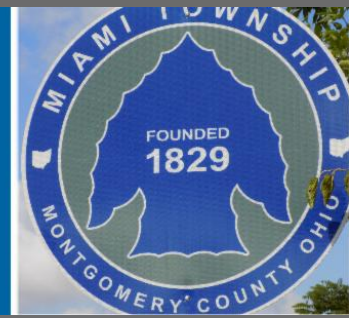

## Miami Township to follow Ohio's lead *COVID health orders expire June 2*

The Ohio Department of Health's COVID health orders expire June 2, 2021. While Miami Township will continue to monitor the situation and make any necessary changes per future state orders, we will be opening our services fully to citizens. The Government Center will no longer require masks and social distancing. Any COVID protocols will be voluntary beginning June 2. The following will take effect June 2, 2021:

- **Board of Trustees** meetings will return to in-person meetings beginning Tuesday, June 15. The meeting begins at 6 p.m., at the Government Center, 2700 Lyons Road, on the second floor.
- The **Zoning Commission** will return to in-person meetings beginning Tuesday, June 8, beginning at 6 p.m. on the second floor of the Government Center. There are no scheduled appeals before the **Board of Zoning Appeals** this month. The next scheduled meeting is July 13.
- The **Community Room** is reopening. You can now reserve the room in the same way you would make a park shelter reservation. Call (937) 433-9969 for more information.
- Some meetings may still be offered via Zoom teleconference. A notice will be made in advance. Participants can still sign up to attend a specific Zoom meeting [here](#).

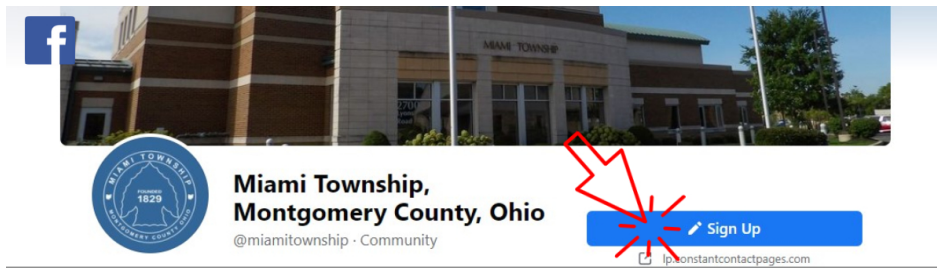
## Did You Know?

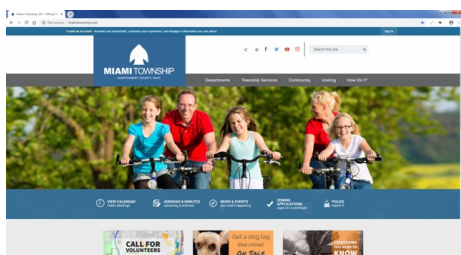
