What Do I Do When...



Spring is upon us and residents are most likely prepping for spring cleaning, planning trips and finally getting outside for some recreation. So, we compiled our first ever *'What Do I Do When...'* issue to help you plan! Here goes! What do I do when...



Park reservations: Township residents and businesses have first dibs on park reservations until April 15. Anyone can make reservations after April 15. Reserving a park shelter is free, but Miami View and Layer park shelters require a \$10 refundable deposit for keys to the restrooms. *Reservations must be made online.* For more information and to reserve a shelter, **CLICK NOW.**



Community Room: The Community Room is the perfect place for non-profit groups to conduct meetings. Use is limited to Miami Township residents/businesses only. Any applicable fees must be paid within five days of use. Use of the kitchen must be requested in advance. *Reservations must be made online and you must have proof of residency. Certain restrictions for parties apply.* For more information and to check availability, **CLICK NOW.**



Sports equipment nuisances: Any sports equipment placed within the road right-of-way is prohibited. For example, a portable basketball hoop cannot be placed on the curb (see photo). The right-of-way is typically ten feet from the side of the road. Residents in violation will first receive an informational door hanger asking that the equipment be removed before any further action is taken. For more

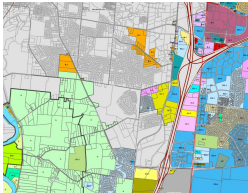

Trailer parking: Recreational vehicles, boats, campers, etc. should be parked or stored to the rear or on the side of a structure not jutting out to the street. These vehicles should only occupy 400 sq. feet of space and only two vehicles are permitted per property. For more information, please read the *Zoning Exterior Property Maintenance Code*. Trash cans: Keep your home free of trash by placing it in an approved, covered receptacle. Trash cans stored outside must be stored at the side or rear of a structure. Homeowners have 24 hours before and after their assigned pickup day to leave trash cans at the curb for trash collection. Zoning applications: Some construction projects like fences, sheds and commercial signs require a zoning permit. The process is made simple by going to our website to apply for a zoning certificate. For more information and to apply, [CLICK NOW](#).



Right-of-Way projects: If you are planning a project such as curb/gutter replacement, a driveway apron, etc., you need a right-of-way permit. For more information, [CLICK NOW](#).

The MVFD serves both Miami Township and the city of Miamisburg. It has nearly 70 employees who operate out of five fire stations and handle roughly 10,000 calls a year.



Austin Landing charging stations fired up

Four charging stations are now ready for electric cars at Austin Landing. Miami Township, along with the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission, helped Austin Landing secure an Ohio EPA grant worth \$22,500 for the stations. They are located inside the parking garage next to the cinemas.

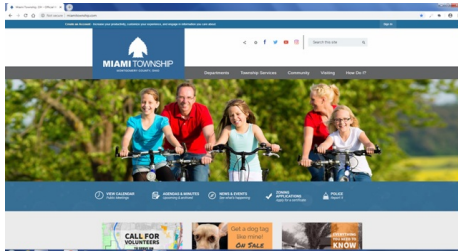
